Position Summary

Reporting to the Youth Program Supervisor (or designate), the Youth Program Worker will support the planning and delivery of youth programs, ensuring that activities are safe, inclusive, and engaging. This role works directly with youth participants (12-19 years old), assisting program team with mentorship, recreation, workshops, and community events.

Job Responsibilities

- Support the delivery of youth programs, including drop-ins, workshops, and community events.
- Mentor and engage youth participants in activities such as sports, recreation, arts, and personal development.
- Support youth-centred activities that contribute to an inclusive, engaged, and harmonious environment for youth.
- Build positive relationships with youth, families, and community members.
- Support youth engagement through outreach, relationship-building, and consistent program presence.
- Assist with program planning, evaluation, and reporting as part of the Youth Program team.
- Support crisis prevention, de-escalation, and emergency response using a trauma-informed approach.
- Collaborate with the program team to ensure daily opening and closing procedures of designated youth program spaces, and appropriate upkeep of facilities (clean, tidy, attractive, protected from misuse/theft, etc.).
- Participate in staff training, meetings, and community events as required.
- Support cross-departmental collaboration, contribute with enthusiasm to WWCC initiatives, and embody the values of Warden Woods as part of our unique communities.
- Other duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Minimum one year of experience working with youth in a community setting.
- Demonstrated ability to deliver and adapt different types of programming for young people.
- Demonstrated understanding of barriers facing youth within Warden Woods and how to apply a trauma-informed approach.
- Ability to plan and facilitate group activities and support youth engagement in a respectful and inclusive way.
- Strong interpersonal and communications skills, with the ability to build rapport with youth.
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively within a team environment.
- Understanding of equity, inclusion, and anti-oppressive practices.
- Knowledge of community life in Southwest Scarborough is an asset.
- Currently enrolled/completed education in recreation, social work, or child and youth work is an asset.
- Standard First Aid & CPR C Certificate and Food Handler's Certification are an asset.
- A clear Criminal Reference Check is a condition of employment.
- Must be legally entitled to work in Canada.
